"Echoes" of the Venetian Republic

The link between Venice and the Dolomites is strong; it is more than just geography, they have a historical and emotional connection. On a clear day, from the lagoon you can glimpse the jagged peaks on the horizon, a stunning backdrop to the city of Venice and a skyline like no other in the world. The link is strong and significant, given that both are World Heritage sites of outstanding universal value. Their beauty is unrivalled and they show how man can live in perfect symbiosis with his environment. Their unique yet diverse nature makes them a legacy for future generations.



THE DOLOMITES AND THE LAGOON

Mountain museums

A unique feature of the Belluno area and the Dolomites as a whole is their mountain museums. From the highest museum in Europe - the Museum of the Great War on the Marmolada - to the Museum in the Clouds on Monte Rite, which is part of the Messner Mountain Museums network. These places combine stunning 360-degree views with locations and collections of great historical interest.


Two other repositories of local heritage that are well worth a visit are the museum at Andraz Castle, located along the ancient road in Val Cordevole that connected the iron mines with the smelting furnaces, and the Angiul Sali museum-house in the ancient village of Costalta in S. Pietro di Cadore.



MARMOLADA GREAT WAR MUSEUM

Stunning landscape and an outstanding example of the earth's history

These are the two motivations for the inclusion of the Dolomites on the UNESCO Natural World Heritage List: their unique and beautiful landscapes and their geological and geomorphic significance. While you can appreciate the Dolomite landscape as you travel through the villages, valleys and passes, a visit to one of the area's geological or palaeontological museums gives a better understanding of the origin of these mountains, which were once an archipelago of coral reefs and volcanic islands in a tropical sea. The unique collection of fossils from the Ampezzo Dolomites displayed in the Zardini Palaeontological Museum in Cortina, whose beauty and variety are second to none, is a great insight into life at the time. Similarly, the Geological and Mining Museum of Agordo tells the story of the mining industry in the Val Imperina and has a collection of the oldest fossils found in the Dolomites. Still in Agordo, in the courtyard of the Mining School, visitors can walk "One hundred steps through the geology of the Dolomites" with panels illustrating the stratigraphic sequence of the mountains and samples of rocks that they can actually touch. The local museum in Selva di Cadore has casts of the footprints of Triassic dinosaurs.

Tiziano Vecellio and the masters of colour

Thanks to artists of international acclaim such as Tiziano Vecellio (known as Titian), who was born in Pieve di Cadore where his house still stands, Ippolito Caffi, Sebastiano and Marco Ricci, as well as contemporary artists, the art museums in the province of Belluno are a real treasure trove for art lovers. The works, with their masterly brushstrokes and vibrant colours, transport visitors back in time to a world of myths and legends for a truly unforgettable experience. The art collections in the museums of Belluno and Feltre are particularly worthy of note.

Ethnography, arts and crafts

The Ethnographic Museum of the Dolomites gives an invaluable insight into the traditions of the people who lived in and around Belluno. Housed in a classical Venetian villa, in spring it is a riot of colour thanks to the lovely rose gardens in its grounds. Then there are the ethnographic museums of Ladin culture in the north of the province and of Cimbric culture in Alpaigo and Cansiglio. Lovers of traditional arts and crafts should visit the museums dedicated to the chair makers of Gosaldo and Rivamonte, the stone cutters of Castellavazzo, the raft makers of Codisgò, the nail makers and ice cream makers of the Val di Zoldo, the eggshell makers of Pieve di Cadore and Agordo, the iron and glass artists at the Rizzarda Gallery of Modern Art in Feltre and the master sword makers of Renaissance times in Palazzo Fulcis, Belluno.



Museums and more

Throughout the province are places that cannot strictly be called museums but which are just as interesting and give visitors a better understanding of life in our valleys. For instance, there is an open-air museum in Cencenighe, where the exclusive Dolomia del Serla stone is extracted, which is dedicated to stone cutters. San Tomaso Agordino, on the other hand, is home to the Centro "Orti Rupersti", a centre where seeds of ancient varieties of local plants are collected, grown, preserved and exchanged. The recently inaugurated CICO

(Multimedia Information Centre in Comelico) provides visitors with all the information they need about the museums in the beautiful Comelico valley, including an ancient dairy in Farra di Mel which has reopened its doors and a display of Dolomite Carnival masks from Gianni Secco's collection in Borgo Piave, Belluno. The cultural heritage of our valleys is so vast, there isn't enough room for everything on one map, so visit our tourist information offices to learn more about what the Belluno Dolomites have to offer. You'll be amazed.

From the Michelangelo of wood to the masters of wrought iron

Two traditional materials found in the Dolomites - wood and iron - are showcased in a number of museums throughout the region, along with the Belluno artists who made a name for themselves with these particular materials: possibly the most famous is the sculptor Andrea Brustolon, whom Honoré de Balzac called the "Michelangelo of wood" and whose works can be seen in the Fulcis Museum in Belluno and the Diocesan Museum of Holy Art in Feltre. But other similarly accomplished sculptors include Valentino Panciera Besarel (Brustolon's protégé), Carlo Rizzarda from Feltre and Augusto Murar from Palcaade.

The first Dolomite settlers

People have been attracted to the beautiful province of Belluno for thousands of years. In fact there are two archaeological museums dedicated to the earliest Dolomite settlers in the region. The "Vittorino Cazzetta" Museum in Selva di Cadore explores the life of Valmo, the Mondeval Man, a hunter from the Mesolithic Age who was buried on the mountain with a rich array of grave goods. There is also the Archaeological Museum of Belluno and the recently inaugurated Muvar - Museum of the Man of Val Rosna - on the Sovramonte plateau that tells the story of an even older hunter who lived in the Palaeolithic age and has become famous thanks to the painted stonks that covered his burial site. The Archaeological Museums of Pieve di Cadore and Mel, the new ultra-modern archaeological section in Feltre's town museum and the Palazzo Corte Metto Museum in Auronzo di Cadore are all well worth a visit.

Popes, museums and other curiosities

The province of Belluno has long been associated with popes. Pope Gregory XVI and Pope John Paul I were both born here, while Pope John Paul II and Pope Benedict XVI chose this area for their summer retreat. No visit would be complete without seeing the museum and house in Canale d'Agordo where Pope John Paul I was born to learn more about the "Smiling Pope" and the museum dedicated to Pope Wojtyła in Lorenzago. Other more unusual museums to explore include the Alchemist's House in Valdenogher, the Museum of Wooden Sculptures in San Gregorio nelle Alpi, the Bicycle Museum in Cesiomaggiore and the Museum of Dreams and Memory in Feltre.

Museums in the province of Belluno

The province of Belluno is home to a wealth of museums and permanent collections of archaeological, artistic, historical, ethnographic and naturalistic interest. Some of them reflect the intrinsic nature of the UNESCO property, especially the palaeontology and geology museums, while others are fascinating "museums of memories", giving an insight into the history of local crafts and trades from ancient times up to the present day. Collections are displayed in historic rooms, castles, Venetian villas, unconventional buildings and even an ancient brewery. So much to explore!

Museums and collections

If you are reading this map, you – like us – believe museums are of great importance, they give us an insight into the identity of a place and are a way of preserving its cultural, historical and natural heritage. In our case, the local museums in the Belluno region are key to understanding the character and culture of the places they are in. Many of these museums are housed in ancient palaces or buildings of historical interest or collective significance, such as schools, dairies and public barns. Not only are they testimony to the rich architectural heritage of the province, they also underline the link between museums and local traditions.



The cultural heritage of the province of Belluno

The province of Belluno is home to a host of different museums and permanent collections of artistic, historical, archaeological, ethnographic and naturalistic importance. This map shows the museums in the province of Belluno. All the museums are colour coded to make them easier to find.

The main civic museums are located in the most important historical, political and administrative centres, such as Belluno, Feltre and Pieve di Cadore. The collection in the Diocesan Museum of Holy Art in Feltre is of great artistic and religious significance and includes artefacts from the whole province, offering a broad overview of the religious art of the area.

Museums of historical and artistic importance include:

- > the 'Carlo Rizzarda' Gallery of Modern Art which displays the art collection and works of the master of wrought iron from Feltre and also the Nassi-Franzonia collection of Venetian glass.

> the 'Augusto Murer' Museum with the work of this sculptor from Agordo.

> the 'Mario Rimoldi' Museum of Modern Art in Cortina d'Ampezzo, which preserves one of the most interesting and prestigious collections of modern art in Italy.

War, and in particular the First World War, shaped the history of Italy and the local area and is the subject of many museums and thematic routes which have been created using original testimonies, artefacts and constructions such as trenches, military posts and tunnels.

Most of the ethnographic museums in the district were established by local people, opening between 1960 and 1970.

The collections span the period between the 19th and 20th centuries and give an important insight into the forestry and lumber industry, cattle rearing and farming.

These museums also explore the history of local crafts, such as chair making in Agordo or nail making in the Val di Zoldo, activities which were closely linked to seasonal emigration.

Agordo and Pieve di Cadore are home to two special museums, historically an important industry in the Belluno area which flourished from the late 19th century onwards, thanks to a group of enlightened businessmen who realised the importance of this sector and its potential for growth.

Museums of ethnographic interest include:

> the museums in Cortina d'Ampezzo and Dosoleo di Comelico Superiore with sections about the 'Regole', a form of collective land ownership and management which can still be found in the north of the province.

> the Ethnographic Museum of the Dolomites, which is an ethnology and anthropology research and documentation centre, housing artefacts and documents from the entire province.

Museums of archaeological interest include:

- > the Museum of Man in Cansiglio and the Archaeological Museums of Mel, Selva, Auronzo di Cadore and Pieve di Cadore, whose artefacts trace the presence of man in the area from as early as the Paleolithic age.

The extraordinary beauty and wealth of the natural heritage of the Belluno district is the subject of a number of natural history museums, such as the Zardini collection in Cortina d'Ampezzo or the collection belonging to the Follador Mining School in Agordo. Lastly, the collections in the Natural History Museum of Alpego and the Museum of Auronzo di Cadore are of great local interest.
